¹ Statutes/legislation may not expressly address hours and attendance requirements (e.g., home instruction, blizzard bags, alternative schools). Unless statutes/legislation expressly exempt districts from these obligations, the obligations are marked as applicable.

² Remote learning is not defined. Given this, there is no express language that would require that remote learning be offered onsite, online, otherwise remote, or any combination of options. A district's attendance and participation requirements must be addressed in its plan.

³ The approved plan must be submitted to ODE.

⁴ The current deadline for submission of approved remote learning plans to ODE is July 31, however, ODE may consider extending this deadline.

⁵ Blended learning requires a combination of in-person and online learning (and does not contemplate other forms of "remote" learning like paper packets).

⁶ Only notice (using a Blended Learning Declaration) needs to be provided to ODE.

⁷ The blended learning deadline to implement or to cease operation of a blended learning program was extended from July 1 to November 1 for the 2020-2021 school year.

⁸ Alternative schools are limited to students with disruptive or behavioral issues.

⁹ Online/blizzard bags are limited to three days.

¹⁰ Home instruction, by statute, is limited to students with disabilities.
